

Course costs

Dear Student, Parent, Guardian,

There are a number of courses that require an extra charge. These charges are for items that the student retains with them at the end of the course.

These payments should be paid by 11th September 2019.

Students can bring cash or a cheque to their Enrolment interview. Cheques should be made payable to 'Varndean College'.

Or payments can be made once the student is enrolled, through the College Website at the Online Payments services found in the Parent/Carers or Student section <https://pay.varndean.ac.uk/> or by going in person to the Finance Office. You can also pay over the phone by contacting the Finance office on 01273 508011. If you are experiencing difficulty in paying for any Course Costs, please contact the Finance Office directly.

Students can apply for help with these costs if they fall into a priority group for the Bursary or Discretionary Learning Grant; eligible students will have these payments automatically deducted. Please check the Financial Support section on our website for details.

Students provide their own sketchbooks and printing paper for Photography, which can be bought at cost from the College shop. There may also be some one-off charges for specialist materials on some courses.

NB: There are a number of courses where students are expected to go on trips as part of their course and these need to be paid for. This is particularly true for students studying Visual Arts, Public Services, Drama, Geography and Travel and Tourism courses.

What are the Visual Arts Course materials fees paying for?

Advanced level students have 3 lessons per week so that means over 100 practical lessons in each year. Other colleges in the local area ask for more in charges for doing Visual Arts A levels. A3 Varndean college embossed sketchbooks are great value if you compare them to similar books on sale in town and we sell those at cost price from the college shop to support students and make it as affordable and easy for them as possible.

Advanced Level Art / International Baccalaureate Art The materials charge in Art is for 2 years. It contributes towards 'consumables' that are used by/given to students in lessons - including oil, acrylic and watercolour paint, many different kinds of paper, printing inks and rollers, pens, graphite, tools, brushes, wire, plaster, charcoal, oil and chalk pastels, adhesives, A1 plastic storage bags, reference books etc. Students also purchase sketchbooks and boards or canvas to work on in class.

Advanced Level Graphic Design The materials charge in Graphic Design is for 2 years. It contributes towards many things, most of them 'consumables' that are used by/given to students in lessons including papers, paints and brushes, printing inks, photocopying, specialist pens, glues and tapes, A1 plastic storage bags and reference books. Students may need to contribute towards the cost of inkjet prints and mount boards for final finished pieces. Additional costs may apply depending on what students choose to design for their individual projects.

Advanced Level Photography The materials charge in Photography is for 2 years (AS Photo is one year only). It contributes towards many things, most of them 'consumables' that are used by/given to students in lessons - including - darkroom chemicals, negative bags, A1 plastic storage bags, acetate sheets, reference books etc. Students are asked to buy a box of photographic paper, which has 100 sheets in it; most students use that carefully and it lasts them a whole year. Students will also need to buy films and print tokens for inkjet prints, depending on the nature of the project.

Advanced 3D Design The materials charge in 3D Design is for 2 years. It contributes towards many things, most of them 'consumables' that are used by/given to students in lessons - including – photocopying, drawing pens, glues, wood, acrylic, plastics, metal, wire, light fittings, paper, A1 plastic storage bags etc. We also use this money for saw blades, nuts/bolts/screws etc. replacement of hand tools, scalpels, drill bits etc.as well as towards major equipment such as a fret saw, spot welder or electric drill. Students may have to buy some additional materials themselves to include in their work if they for example need coloured acrylic sheet or a specific type of metal, depending on what they choose to construct.

Advanced Level Textiles The materials charge in Textiles is for 2 years. It contributes towards many things, most of them 'consumables' that are used by/given to students in lessons - including - paint, printing inks, dyes, fabric, thread, papers, A1 plastic storage bags, reference books etc. Students may have to buy some additional fabrics themselves to include in their work, depending on what they choose to create.

Pre Advanced GCSE Photography – The materials charge is for one year. It contributes towards many things, most of them 'consumables' that are used by/given to students in lessons - including – specialist papers, pens, darkroom chemicals, A1 plastic storage bags, acetate sheets, reference books etc. Later in the course, students will also need to buy print tokens for inkjet prints and we encourage students on this course to have their own USB stick.

Pre Advanced BTEC First Certificate in Art & Design. This larger course has 12 periods per week so over 220 hours of practical lessons in total. The materials charge is for one year. It contributes towards many things, most of them 'consumables' that are used by/given to students in lessons – including – paint, paper, printing inks, clay, wire, fabrics, heat transfer dyes, lino, pens, A1 plastic bags, watercolour paints, reference books etc. Later in the course, students may need to purchase boards or canvas to work on, depending on their choice of exam final piece.

Life Drawing – The materials charge is for one short enrichment course. It contributes towards many things including Life Model fees, papers, charcoal, inks, paint, pastels etc.

Digital Illustration - The materials charge is for one short enrichment course. It contributes towards the cost of inkjet prints and mountcard and an A1 plastic storage bag.

With Visual arts courses, learners leave at the end with more than just a grade and expertise, they leave with a physical portfolio of work, which can be so valuable in seeking employment or progression to another course after college.
