

The Biology Intermediate Olympiad is a competition open to students in the first year of post-16 education, consisting of a one-hour multiple choice paper to which is taken online. Questions are set on topics students are likely to have covered at GCSE and in their first year of A level, but additional ideas are introduced requiring their

problem-solving skills and understanding of core principles, as well as a knowledge of Biology beyond the syllabus.

As part of their prize, Nyx will be attending a field trip to study ecology during October half term organised by the Institute of Biology. This was only available to a very small number of students in the whole country. A superb achievement.

<u>Biology students reap crest gold awards</u>

CREST is a national scheme which helps inspire young people to think and behave like scientists and engineers. With six competition levels available, from 5-7 year olds to those aged 16+, the scheme helps children and young people become independent and reflective learners through an enquiry-based project. In the 16+ age category, taking a minimum of 70 hours, students must complete a project which makes an original contribution to a STEM field of study, whilst working with an external mentor from their chosen STEM field category. trial the Photofolia app which has been developed by the university to measure chlorophyll levels in plants. The students were mentored by Dr Haruko Otamoto, senior lecturer in Biochemistry and Dr John Anderson at the university, principal lecturer, Brighton and Sussex medical school and supported by Yaso Shan and Brian Marriott in college.

Each student investigated a different use of the app,

designed their own method, gathered and processed the data and produced a report in the format of a scientific paper. This is an outstanding achievement by all

three students and will give them valuable skills for their future degrees. CREST Gold awards can be used by students to enhance their UCAS personal statements and are recognised and respected by universities and employers.

Vocational qualifications achieved a pass rate of 99%, with over half of students achieving the coveted Distinction* or Distinction.

BRIGHTON GEOGRAPHICAL ASSOCIATION LECTURES

Geography and Environmental Science students have the opportunity to attend monthly lectures by the Brighton Geographical Association. Held at the University of Brighton, the lectures are delivered by local academics and keu experts from the business and voluntary sectors and provide valuable case study material and insights into topics that appear in our college curriculum. Speakers discuss current research, as well as highlighting academic and career progression opportunities.

The October lecture 'wrong trees in the wrong place issues in maintaining planetary health through large-scale afforestation' was delivered by Professor Rebecca Elmhirst from the University of Brighton and discussed the context of carbon sequestration through tree planting. The next lecture on 20th November by Dr Gary Fuller from Imperial College London is titled 'The Invisible killer - Air pollution'. Dr Fuller is one of three national clean air champions for UK Research and Investment and is a regular contributor to The Guardian newspaper.

Congratulations to former Varndean student, Jack Pattison, who in July won the Pewter Live 2024 Student Competition for his Pewter point Pencil, inspired by metal point drawing, which was exhibited at the V&A earlier this month.

Jack (formerly of Patcham High School) was a student with us from 2020-2022, studying 3D Design, Geography & Early Modern History. He then went on to study Product & Furniture Design at the University of Plymouth.

Jack's 3D Design tutor, Sarah Lampard Sawyer, said about Jack's time with us, "I am so incredibly proud of Jack, he worked so hard, learnt so much with us and produced amazing work. Jack showed a huge talent in design."

Jack said about his award-winning entry, "My design is a pencil made from one solid piece of pewter. I discovered earlier in the year that pewter has the ability to make marks just like a piece of graphite, and as far as I can tell, this function of pewter has never been explored in its nearly 4000-year history! What sets it apart is the way that you can write with any part of it, you can create fine lines, bold lines, calligraphy lines, rubbings etc. all with one pencil - which makes it a very versatile tool".

Varndean College was thrilled to announce the exceptional performance of its students in the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme in July. Our students outperformed the global average by a stonking four points showcasing Varndean College as world class yet again.

Varndean College students achieved an impressive average diploma score of 34.34 out of 45 and an outstanding pass rate of 97.73%. That is more than 4 points higher than the global average of 30.32 secured by 187,826 students worldwide with a pass rate of 80%

The IB Diploma Programme at Varndean College is renowned for its holistic and exceptional approach to education, fostering not only academic excellence but also the development of critical thinking, research skills, and global awareness. Through this programme, students become globally minded citizens, equipped with a broad set

of skills and knowledge that prepare them for success in higher education and beyond.

"We are immensely proud of our students and how hard theu have worked over the past two years," said Diploma Programme Coordinator Lee Finlay-Gray. "The IB Diploma Programme is a rigorous and challenging course to study, and our students' achievements are a testament to their dedication, resilience, and intellectual curiosity Our students have embraced the challenge of the IB Diploma Programme and have excelled. On 1 July, Varndean College representatives attended the Citizens UK General Election Assembly in London, where community leaders shared testimony and asked politicians from different parties for change on the living wage, citizenship, housing, mental health and more. Varndean's SU President, Lysander Pierce, spoke on behalf of our young people, addressing Angela Rayner to campaign for better mental health support. Speaking at the event, he stated "We need statutory counselling in every school & college in England, so every young person has support. Plus, votes at 16 to take the next step in our democracy".

Later in July, the Student Union then took a trip to London to attend a further Citizens UK meeting where they had the opportunity to hear about the impactful work Citizens UK has been doing in various critical areas. These include initiatives to improve mental health support, efforts to end racial inequality in education, and strategies to tackle the housing crisis. The visit provided valuable insights and a deeper understanding of the significant contributions Citizens UK is making towards building a fairer society.

In October, our Student Ambassadors visited Varndean School where they met Sian Berry, Green Party MP for Brighton Pavilion, and Emma Daniel, Brighton & Hove Cabinet member responsible for Children, Families and Youth Services. The College's campaign proved a huge success, with the Council agreeing to fund free counselling in all of the Brighton & Hove secondary schools. 


MISSION SPACE LAB

First year 3D Design students went on a site visit to launch their Architecture project. A trip was held to Brighton Seafront where students were able to study the seafront architecture, visit the Sea Life Centre and most importantly, visit the Sea Lanes site as the context for their first practical project. Students undertook extensive drawing and recording to use back in the workshop to develop ideas for their project.

Second year 3D Design students visited Hyde Park to see the current 2024 Serpentine Pavilion by Minsuk Cho. Titled Archipelagic Void, the Pavilion is composed of five 'islands', each structure is unique in size, height and form. This trip was to launch their Personal Investigation. This site will be the

location for their own architectural or product-based responses. It's used as inspiration for design ideas and understanding the concepts behind other designers' work.

From 1-4 October, a group of Geography, Environmental Science and Travel & Tourism students rambled amongst the rugged lava fields, cascading water, basaltic geo forms, glaciers and volcanic mountains that make up the Icelandic tectonic shield. Their trip to Iceland concluded with a finale of colourful street art and nature



inspired buildings in the capital and the trip was deemed a great success by students and staff.

Our ambitious Year 1 & 2 Textiles students had an inspiring day at The Knitting and Stitching Show at the Alexandra Palace, London. Students connected with incredible textiles artists, explored innovative and beautiful work, and had the amazing opportunity to meet Holly Searle. The visit was such a positive experience.

Year 1 A Level Drama & Theatre students had an unforgettable experience at the iconic Globe Theatre in London, where they watched a lively performance of 'A Comedy of Errors'. The trip offered students a unique opportunity to witness Shakespeare's work in the setting it was originally intended for!

In June, Varndean College took students to Ashdown Forest in East Sussex for a field trip for one day so that they can gather data for their coursework.

As part of the IB ESS course, our IB students are required to complete a piece of coursework called an Internal Assessment (IA) which constitutes 25% of the final grade. One of the best ways to cover

this is for students to conduct an individual study, usually in the form of an ecological investigation.

IB STUDENTS EXAMINE RENEWABLE ENERGY

Recently our IB students got the chance to examine renewable energy by visiting the Rampion Offshore Wind Farm visitor centre.

Students were able to discover the importance of offshore wind energy and explore how this relates to climate change and modern lifestyles. They also learned how electricity is generated from wind and how it feeds into the national grid distribution network, being prioritised over gas-generated electricity whenever it is made. They were able to experience a virtual reality of climbing up and

witnessing the inner workings of the impressive wind turbines and generators within.

Yaso Shan, IB tutor on the Environmental Systems and Societies course commented, "This course covers important aspects of sustainable energy and Varndean College is very lucky to have Rampion on its doorstep. It's an ideal opportunity for our students to keep pace with current technologies and new approaches to renewable energy sources as it will become more relevant than ever for them and their future generations."


