For five days, staff and students had the opportunity to view an array of impressive artwork, with a separate private viewing being held for students' families. Year 2 student, Dorothy Hepburne (formerly of Varndean School), who had one of her pieces chosen for the exhibition's publicity poster, is pictured here with her two proud grandmothers who came to view her amazing work.

Dorothy explored the themes of change and transformation through portraiture. She looked at the way connections between family members can appear to bridge the gap between the past and the present whilst simultaneously emphasising the time that has passed. By fragmenting portraits with light and mirrors, or dissolving the subjects into their surroundings or themselves, she hoped to convey a sense of impermanence and transition. Dorothy was inspired by Emilio Villabla's fractured portraits and Joanna Nam's use of lighting and colour to give her paintings a fantastical atmosphere.

# SOCIOLOGY STUDENTS RECEIVE VISIT FROM INSTITUTE OF EMPLOYMENT STUDIES

In January, our A Level Sociology students received a visit from Kate Alexander from the Institute of Employment Studies. Kate discussed how studying Sociology can lead to a career in social research. She explained about some of the research she has carried out on the impact that Covid has had on work and pay (particularly for those in low paid jobs with zero hours contracts), and explained practical routes into social research as a career.



Varndean continued with its hugely successful and inspirational Careers Spotlight Workshops this last term.

Our A Level Business students had the opportunity to take part in a Business Careers immersive workshop run by Hannah Coe from the University of Surrey. The workshop incorporated marketing theory and practices and reflected on the role and activities of the marketing teams in a wide range of businesses.

In January, our Drama and Performing Arts students listened to Kim Byford, Director for the Talent Accelerator Project at the De La Warr Pavilion, who delivered an

insightful presentation on the diverse career opportunities within the creative industries. During her talk, Kim shared recent figures indicating that the creative industry significantly contributes £115.9 billion in Gross Value Added to the UK economy. Remarkably, this surpasses the combined contributions of the aerospace, automotive, life sciences, and oil and gas sectors! The session featured engaging Zoom interviews with a variety of creative professionals, providing valuable insights and perspectives for students to explore.

Our 3D Design students were treated to a captivating talk and

activity session with designer and entrepreneur, Richard Palmer. Richard shared his career journey, offering valuable insights into the dynamic world of design and entrepreneurship.

We also had the pleasure of welcoming Helen Hauduc, fashion & knitwear designer for high street brand Fat Face, to speak to our Textiles students on 1st March.

Helen shared so much wonderful insight into her role, how her background in graphic design influenced her work, her experiences working with Antoni and Allison and the design and manufacture process in her current role.



As part of the nationwide series of events for Green Careers Week in November, Varndean College hosted Claire Potter from the University of Sussex, who presented a very informative and useful talk on the circular economy.

She discussed the different opportunities that are present, not only in the green sector, but in a variety of other sectors. Students studying the IB Environmental Systems and Societies course, as well as BTEC Environmental Sustainability, were able to benefit from the ideas that were presented.

She also provided details into the role that design plays in the circular economy, with a focus on some examples of how green pathways can be shown through product design and discuss entry into suitable careers that students would not have considered. The talk provided



an opportunity for the college to help create students who are well versed in the circular economy and how that can be applied in product/3D design as well as service design and behaviour change amongst other examples.

Their submission stood out among entries from teams worldwide and was honoured as one of seven Highly Commended entries in the competition.

The competition, attracting teams from Years 11-13, tasked participants with creating videos addressing ethical dilemmas and exploring the concept of responsibility.

The global participation spanning Africa, Asia, Europe, and South America makes this achievement even more impressive. Being placed within the elite top ten entries is a testament to the hard work, creativity, and ethical insight of our students. This accomplishment reflects the excellence and commitment to ethical awareness within our enrichment ASPIRE programme. Congratulations to the students and their mentor Emma-Jayne Hanner for this outstanding achievement.

#### Varndean students excel in 2024 RSC UK Chemistry Olympiad

Twenty one Varndean A Level and IB Chemistry students entered the 2024 Royal Society of Chemistry Olympiad and this year won 3 Gold, 15 Silver and 3 Bronze awards.

The Chemistry Olympiad is open to schools and colleges throughout the UK, aimed at those students in their last year of study before higher education. The competition is designed to challenge students, develop their thinking and problem-solving skills, and test their knowledge of chemistry in real-world situations. To receive a Bronze award, participants have to score between 10-17 marks, Silver 18-29, and for the prestigious Gold award 30 plus.

This year, there were a staggering 14,915 applicants from 1,025 schools across the UK, a new participation record.

#### Language students get immersive experience abroad

In November, Year 2 French students enjoyed a week in Montpellier, France. A level and IB French students stayed with host families and experienced a truly immersive week, attending a language school and receiving certificates from the EU for completing a 20-hour course. They also visited the Roman town of Nimes and had a wonderful time sightseeing in the South of France.

A Level and IB Spanish students also went to Valencia to be part of a language immersion program. Staying with host families and taking lessons at the Taronja Language School, students commented: "It was an amazing experience, would do again", "it was super fun and it really helped with my Spanish", "the mixture between lessons and cultural activities was excellent."

#### University Psychology Taster Day

A Level & BTEC Psychology students participated in a Psychology Taster Day at the University of Brighton. The students participated in a range of sessions including: an active session on the research undergraduates conduct, eye-tracking experiments on consumer behaviour. change blindness tasks, electroencephalograms, the development of robotic animals to replace pets in environments where animals are not allowed, a lecture on the typical structure of a psychology degree, the mind/body connection debate, cognitive psychology, research and much more!

Throughout the morning, they delved into careers spanning from grounds staff to analysts, and legal to catering.

Last year, over 365,000 students took part in the UK alone, with over 3 million worldwide.

On 10 November, Varndean College had the privilege of hosting Green MP for Brighton and Hove, Caroline Lucas. Caroline spoke with students about how her interest in politics was driven by her firm conviction that the environmental issues facing the planet were not being addressed. She also talked about her love of poetry and literature and how helpful these subjects had been to her success when forging her career in politics. Students were inspired by her drive and commitment and will no doubt be keen to read her forthcoming book.

Students commented: "We valued hearing someone speak so highly of English/Humanities and its many useful applications." and "The Q&A was really insightful and enlightening, plus it was fun. It provided a lot of useful information and was educational as well."

The following week, the Politics Society welcomed Tim Loughton, Conservative MP for East Worthing and Shoreham, who answered questions from students about Gaza, Rwanda, same-sex marriage and civil partnerships, as well as the next General Election.

On 24 November, it was a full classroom again when students again gathered to hear from Lloyd Russell-Moyle MP for Brighton Kemp Town and Peacehaven. Lloyd shared his journey into politics and his roles in Parliament sitting on select committees and going to the next COP.

Later in January, saw another full house with students listening to Hove and Portslade Labour MP, Peter Kyle who inspired students and answered questions about his career in politics. Also in January, we had the pleasure of hosting former student, Sam Woolven, for an insightful talk. Sam shared his valuable experiences in the Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office, focusing on his impactful work in gender and equality. He also delved into the diverse career paths within the Civil Service.

Reflecting on the visit, Sam said, "It was inspiring to return to my sixth form college, Varndean, and talk to students at the Politics Society about my career in diplomacy. Their energy, enthusiasm and knowledge of international affairs was evident. The Foreign Office needs more people like them to join in the coming years."

The following week saw the return of another Varndean alumni, Mark Collins, who talked about his career in the Civil Service with jobs ranging from divorce courts to nuclear non-proliferation.
